



Brigadier Keith Eble studied law at the University of Wales, Aberystwyth and at the Inns of Court School of Law, London. A Barrister, practising initially in London, he has served as a British Army Lawyer since 1996. He has served as a staff officer working at all formation HQs from 1* to 4*, at the UK Ministry of Defence and at the Service Prosecuting Authority. He has served on NATO operations in the Balkans and in Afghanistan, including as the Operational Law Legal Advisor (LEGAD) for Commander ISAF in 2009/10. In 2012, he was appointed as the LEGAD to the 4* Commander Standing Joint Command (UK) and this included being his Principal LEGAD during the London Olympics/Paralympics security operation that year. He completed his last tour as a Lieutenant Colonel as the Commander Legal, Headquarters 1 (UK) Armoured Division, in Germany. After promoting to Colonel in Jan 15, he served at the Army Headquarters, Service Prosecuting Authority and Headquarters Field Army. He promoted to Brigadier in Aug 20 on appointment as Head Operational Law. A graduate of the UK's Advanced Command and Staff Course, he also holds a MA Degree from King's College London.

Chief Commissioner of 1st Class Perrin's career is divided between several dominants in the field of education, operations, law and inter-ministerial crisis management.
